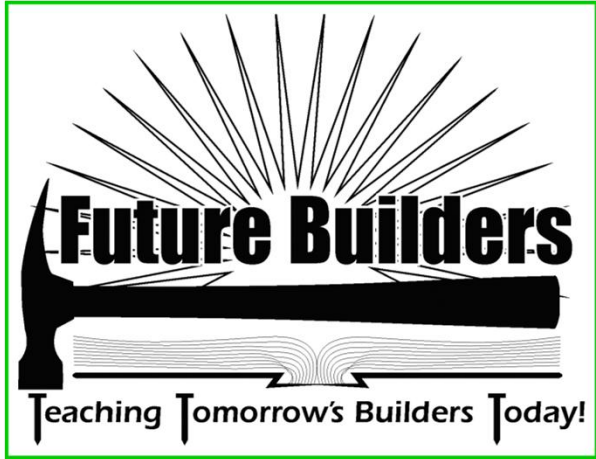

The estimated one-year local impact of building 100 single family homes in Clallam County include:

- \$20.3 million in local income
- \$2.0 million in taxes and other revenue for local governments,
 - 506 local jobs.

These are local impacts, representing income and jobs for residents of Clallam County, and taxes (and other sources of revenue, including permit fees) for all local jurisdictions within the county. They are also one-year impacts that include both the direct and indirect impact of the construction activity itself, and the impact of local residents who earn money from the construction activity spending part of it within the local area.

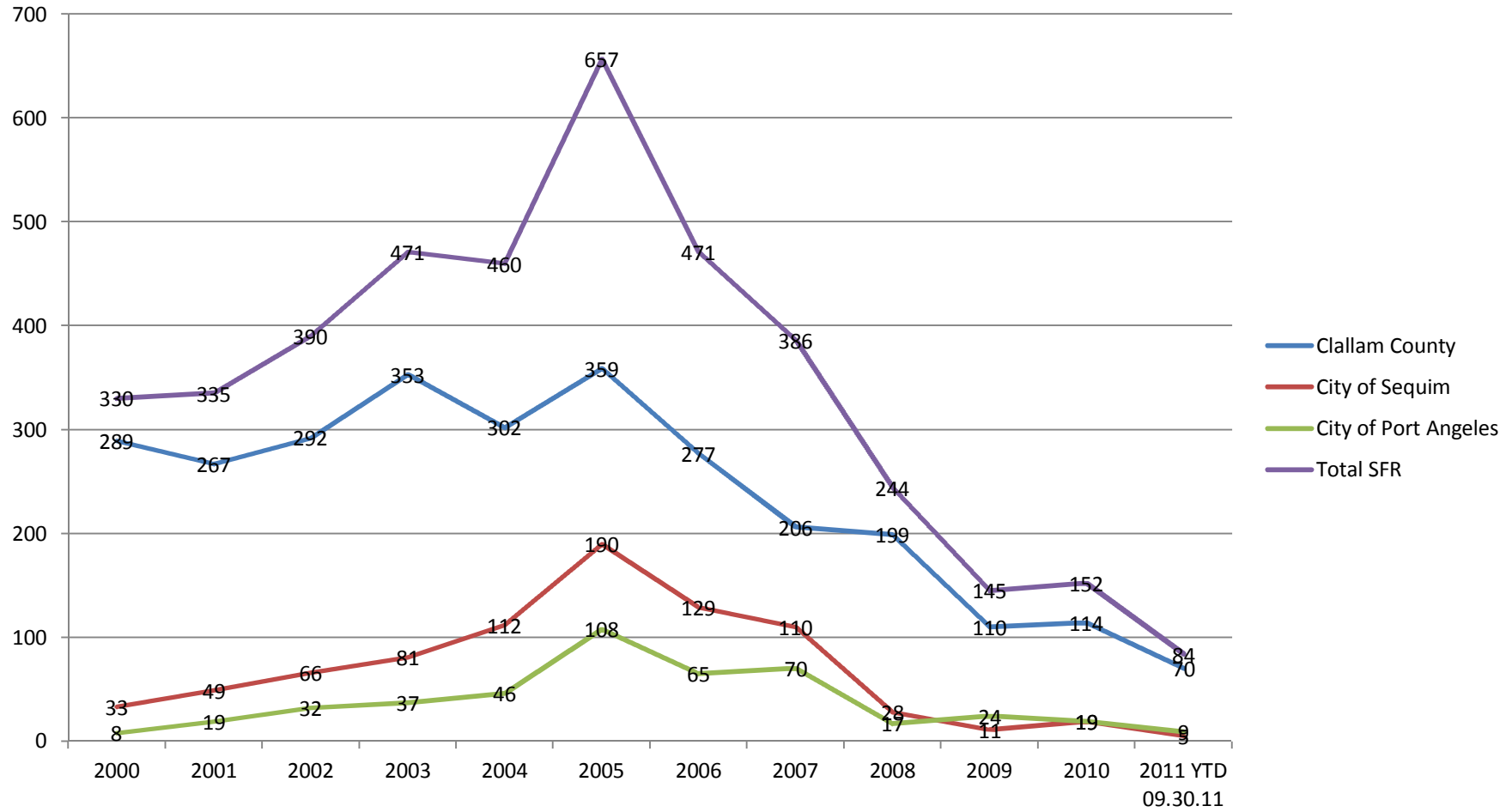
The additional, annually recurring impacts of building 100 single family homes in Clallam County include:

- \$3.6 million in local income,
- \$967,000 in taxes and other revenue for local governments, and
 - 98 local jobs.

These are ongoing, annual local impacts that result from the new homes being occupied, and the occupants paying taxes and otherwise participating in the local economy year after year. In order to fully understand the impact residential construction has on a community, it's important to consider the ongoing benefits as well as the one-time effects.
